#### Who is the MDFG?

The MDFG (Musgamagw Dzawad<u>a</u>'enu<u>x</u>w Fisheries Group) was developed as a Commercial Fishing Enterprise (CFE) of the four tribes (Gwaw<u>a</u>'enu<u>x</u>w, Dzawad<u>a</u>'enu<u>x</u>w, Kwickwasut'inuxw & Haxwa'mis) as part of DFO funded fisheries programming that focuses on first nations acquiring and managing commercial fishing licenses.

For several years now, the Musgamagw Dzawad<u>a</u>'enu<u>x</u>w have been purchasing & managing several licenses: Salmon Gillnet, Herring Gillnet, Prawn, Rockfish, Halibut & Sablefish quota which we lease to support fishery related programs.

There are 25 First Nation owned and managed commercial fishing enterprises (CFEs) in BC.

The commercial fishing industry in BC has drastically changed, but there is still opportunity to reclaim a space in this valued and traditional activity on the coast.

We hope members of the Musgamagw Dzawad<u>a</u>'enu<u>x</u>w can look to start a career in this area, through taking part in the training & for established fishermen, working with us on leasing opportunities offered by the MDFG.

## Preparing a next generation of fisherpeople

The MDFG offers coordinated training related to commercial fishing activities when possible throughout the year.

We have had membership training in:

- Marine Basic First Aid
- Emergency First Responder
- Dive Accident Management & Oxygen Therapy
- Halibut & Prawn Mentoring
- SVOP
- Boat Stability
- Fishing Masters
- Fisheries Field Work




#### Where We Live

The traditional territory of the Musgamagw Dzawada'enuxw is located east of Queen Charlotte Strait to the watershed mainland inlets. There are thousands of traditional names in our territory, but these areas are commonly named as the Broughton Archipelago, including Gilford Island, and the watershed areas of Drury Inlet, Mackenzie Sound, Wakeman Sound and Kingcome Inlet down to Thompson Sound at the mouth of Knight Inlet.

The main port that is used to access the communities and fishing activities is Port McNeill on the northern top of Vancouver Island.
